Agenda Item: Landline Doughnuts Incentives

Executive Summary: Landline Doughnuts, 321 Main St. submitted three grant applications including Retail Conversion, Façade/DIP, and the Residential Grant. They purchased the building and are renovating the ground floor space into a retail doughnut shop and bringing the 2nd floor residential space fire suppression requirements up to code. The total project cost is \$700,000. The specific costs submitted on the grants are as follows:
